One of the chiefs' wives has also been faithfully attending. This is a powerful testimony of how God is opening doors and drawing people to Himself. The community is eager for us to begin Sunday morning services on Easter Sunday, and there is a deep hunger for the Word of God. Many are ready to commit their lives to Christ.
