Starfish #2: Charity



Charity is the second of the starfish God seems poised to help. As you can see (and as many of you know by now) Charity was born with only one leg. But that is not the condition that is scheduled to be treated in July.

Charity has a severe umbilical hernia that is causing her a considerable amount of distress and, according to the doctors at Korle Bu Teaching Hospital, surgery is required. She has an appointment scheduled for July 7.



We are praying for Charity since hospital stays can be traumatic for any child under the best of circumstances (which these are not). Please pray with us not only for her healing but also for the tender mercies of our Lord to make her hospital experience as easy as possible.

Starfish #3: Hannah



Our third highlighted starfish is Hannah. This precious, though spirited little one was born legally blind (though she does seem to be able to see some light and shadows)

Hannah's visual impairment has made it impossible for her to attend school in our community. But the Lord has provided a residential school within a 20-30 minute drive from HOMe that Hannah can attend. Akropong School for the Blind has accepted Hannah for the fall term.

It is a boarding school that provides scholastic education and practical,



day-to-day skills training designed to help children like Hannah learn to function independently. Please be praying for her and for the Dekus as she moves away from HOMe. Fortunately the school is close enough for some weekend and holiday visits back home to HOME.

Running For HOMe-Starfish Rescuing

As much as we love to highlight our starfish, it is not the starfish to whom God promises his presence. It is the Starfish Rescuers.

It is people like the Dekus who invest their lives into the lives of these children. And it is people like you who also invest your resources in the lives of these children.
