Paul reminds us of a very important truth in Philippians 2:13:

It is God who works in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure.

This is the way God designed the Christian life.
Technically, Jesus did not leave us on earth so we could work hard to finish his work. According to this passage of Scripture, Jesus left us on earth so he could finish his work through us. I believe that is why we are referred to as the Body of Christ.

So when we highlight what is being done by those involving themselves in mercy ministry, we are actually pointing out what God is doing through his children—through his body.

Later in Colossians 1:29 Paul reinforces this idea:

I toil, struggling with all his energy that he powerfully works within me.

Paul humbly reminds us that the work he is involved in is not by his own might or power, but through the energy of God himself.

This month I hope to encourage all who read the stories to follow with this truth for two reasons:

First, to remove any doubt that you are capable of be-



ing a mercy extender, not because of who you are, but because of whose you are.

Secondly, as is always the case, I want to make sure we are remaining true to our goal for this newsletter. I want to make sure you hear it when God says, "Here I Am!"


