# Here I Am!

#### He, Not We!

In Numbers 20 we read about the second time God provided water from a rock for the Israelites. True to form they were quarreling with Moses, blaming him for bringing them into the wilderness away from Egypt where they had it so good.

Moses and Aaron went to speak to God about the situation and were told, "Take the staff, and assemble the congregation, you and Aaron your brother, and tell the rock before their eyes to yield its water" (vs. 8).

Then Moses and Aaron gathered the assembly together before the rock, and he said to them, "Hear now, you rebels: shall we bring water for you out of this rock?" (vs. 10).

At this point Moses struck the rock and water came

forth. All seems to be right with the world again.

But that was not

so. This incident cost Moses his entrance to the promised land and God explained why:

Because you did not believe in me, to uphold me as holy in the eyes of the people of Israel, therefore you shall not bring this assembly into the land that I have given them.

Most of us grew up believing that Moses forfeited his entrance into the promised land because he hit the rock instead of speaking to it. But that is not what God said.

God said, "You did not be-

lieve in me, to uphold me as holy in the eyes of the people of Israel." And that was demonstrated through Moses use of the word "we" instead of "he". One little word (only one letter in English) cost Moses dearly.

AT WAMM we are in the middle of a two-month long prayer campaign (see pg. 4). God has already begun answering our prayers (see inside). But, please, as you read these reports, remember, I am sharing with you what He has done, not what we have done.

On October 30, I invited you all to join us on a prayer campaign for the finances of WAMM (see details on page 4). It didn't take long for God to begin answering our prayers. The very next Sunday we were invited to have dinner with some dear friends of ours. These friends regularly support HOMe by sponsoring two of the children in our care. As we were leaving that evening, one of their daughters handed us an envelope. When we returned home we found, to our amazement, a check for in excess of

\$5,000.00. This was the day before our prayer campaign was scheduled to begin.

That following week we received a number of donations from people who had given in the past, but were not monthly supporters. It seems these folks were all prompted to give as we began to pray. It included two \$2,000 gifts and one for \$1,200. Another donor added \$300 to their regular support. A lady who had visited Ghana years ago sent a check for \$440. Someone else agreed to

#### **Two Delayed Gifts**

Were it not for you, we wouldn't have even seen 2025 as a ministry. But God has also provided through some amazing one-time gifts. The first came to our attention on the Wednesday after we began to pray. A gentleman who agreed to pray with us went to work after that first day of prayer to find his boss asking the employees if anyone knew of a non-profit who could use some help right now. It seems they had some money to give away before the year ended. And so he shared about WAMM. His boss responded with a \$50,000.00 check. We received the check three weeks later thanks to USPS.

The second delayed gift came from a pastor who received our call to prayer as his church was going through a series on prayer and as he was preparing to conduct a Bible study on prayer that night. He and his wife had been wondering what

God might have them do with some money they had at their disposal for ministry. So, this dear friend (whom I met in Ghana) sent a donation of \$45,000.00 that very day. However, PayPal apparently thought I needed some stress over this, resulting in our hearing of the donation four weeks later.

Imagine, totaling the \$5,000.00 gift I mentioned above and these two gifts, God provided over \$100,000.00 within two days of our beginning to pray.

This story involves two dinners Debbie and I attended. The first was on a Sunday evening with the Mission Team from our sending church (Kettle Moraine Community Church). At the beginning of 2025, using as much due diligence as we could muster, West African Mercy Ministries developed a budget that we believed would meet the needs of our children's home, House of Mercy (HOMe). We were feeling pretty good about that until February came around. It was then that the Government of Ghana decreased the Cedi/Dollar exchange rate from 15/1 to 10/1. That meant each dollar we sent to HOMe instantly became 33% less valuable.

As a result, 2025 became the most challenging year in our 20-year history when it came to financing. What has been God's response? Instead of increasing our income he recently chose to increase the number of children in our care to 19, the most we have ever had.

Why would he choose to respond like this? I believe it was to focus our attention directly on him through prayer. That way we will not miss it when he provides.

Will you join us in a weekly time of fasting and prayer? I am not sure why it matters to God that I don't eat when I pray, but I cannot deny that fasting and prayer is something he calls us to do. So, in obedience and anticipation we are setting aside each Mondy through the end of the year to call out to God for his provision for the children at HOMe and we would appreciate you joining with us. If you can't fit every Monday into your schedule, please join us when you can.
