The "Looting" of Egypt

The first instance of God providing for Israel during the Exodus is recorded in Exodus 12:35-36.

The people . . . had asked the Egyptians for silver and gold jewelry and for clothing. And the LORD had given the people favor in the sight of the Egyptians, so that they let them have what they asked. Thus they plundered the Egyptians.

I look at this as God's means of providing the start-up funds for the nation of Israel.

Though looting was not involved in WAMM's start-up funding, God did provide resources more than 20 years ago through two unexpected

gifts.

The first came from a couple who were visiting the church I pastored when I announced my resignation. They invited my wife and I to go out for lunch with them and then "blew us out of the water" by handing us a \$20,000.00 check. They did not know about our intentions ahead of time and did not know us all that well either, but God . . .

Later that week a widow lady from a former church had somehow heard of our plans and she presented us with a check for \$10,000.00, all



within a week of my making known our intentions to move to Ghana to begin working with the orphaned and oppressed of that nation.

Thanks be to God for his amazing grace. And to that first couple (you know who you are) thank you again for enabling WAMM to get started. I'll have to thank that dear widow when I see her again in heaven.



The second means of God's provision for the people of Israel during the Exodus that comes to mind has to do with his daily provision of manna. If you think about it, Israel would never have experienced the amazing things God did for him on their journey and as they entered the Promised Land had they not had food to eat to guarantee their survival.

Sometimes I fear we allow the big miracles to overshadow God's daily provision of manna for a people who had no other food source. But Israel would never have seen water from rocks or the crossing of the Jordan or the victory over Jericho had they not been sustained every day.

I don't want that to be true for WAMM. God has used many of you to support WAMM on a monthly/quarterly/annual basis over the past 20 years and that has ensured that we are still "alive". Last month I shared some pretty amazing things

God has done of late, but that could not have happened had WAMM not survived this long.

So, lest I fall into the trap of getting over excited about more "flashy" gifts, I want to thank each and every one of you who have cared enough for Debbe and me and have had compassion for the hurting ones in Ghana but mostly for being available to the Lord throughout the years to provide the necessary resources for this ministry to extend God's love/mercy to those in need. You are our manna and we can't thank you enough.


Water From the Rocks

A third way God provided for the people of Israel is exemplified in the two instances in which he provided water from two different rocks. These are two of the more remarkable miracles, the ones I referred to earlier as "flashy" miracles. And they too were necessary for the survival of the nation of Israel on the journey God had designed for them.

Last month I shared with you, how, that within the first week of our 2025 Prayer Campaign God provided over \$120,000.00 of unusual donations (in addition to providing Debbie and I with a new-to-us vehicle).

2025 was the most challenging year we have faced in our 20 years of existence, brought on largely by a decrease in the Dollar/Cedi exchange rate. That devaluation increased our needs by 33%, something we had no way of anticipating and therefore no way for which to budget as we entered the year.

But God, in answer to prayer, prompted the heart of some of his children to come to our aid and that has allowed us to not only end the year in the black, but to have a larger cash reserve than we had at the beginning of the year.



Again, we thank God and we thank those of you who gave so generously and sacrificially to make this possible. Your availability to God's prompting truly amazed us.



A fourth way that God provided for the people of Israel was in a way that we don't think about so often.

Deuteronomy 29:5 tells us:

I have led you forty years in the wilderness. Your clothes have not

worn out on you, and your sandals have not worn off your feet.

Think about it for forty years the Israelites did not need new clothes or shoes. So how does this apply to God's provision for WAMM.

Bear with me, and understand that I am not calling Pastor William and Priscilla and old pair of shoes, but this dear couple has demonstrated tremendous resilience since they started ministry with us in 2010.

For 15 years these two children of our Lord have worked 24/7 without any vacation. God has given them

the strength and willingness to continue working simply because it is what God has called them to do.

We really have tried to find a way to relieve them, even for a time, but they are insistent that this is the work God has called them to and that God will give the strength they require (obviously not Americans).

We thank God for William and Priscilla and we thank the two of them for their tireless work (or tired work). God has blessed WAMM with them and we pray he will bless them in return many times over.
