Praise the Lord, the funds are available for this little guy's surgery. If you look carefully at his feet you can see that he actually walks on the tops of his toes. Apparently his tendons are so contracted that they cause his feet to curl up, making it impossible for him to walk on the soles of his feet.

We have been holding off on surgery, not because of the lack of a good hospital—the best orthopedic hospital in Ghana is within a 5 minute drive of HOME. It was funding.

But God, through people like you, has removed that obstacle as well. I recently sent the money required so the surgery can be scheduled (nearly \$18,000.00 USD) and now we are simply awaiting an open slot.

Please be in prayer for “Jeremiah” and for all those involved in his care. And thank the Lord for those who have given to ensure that his surgery could happen.

Another Upcoming Surgery

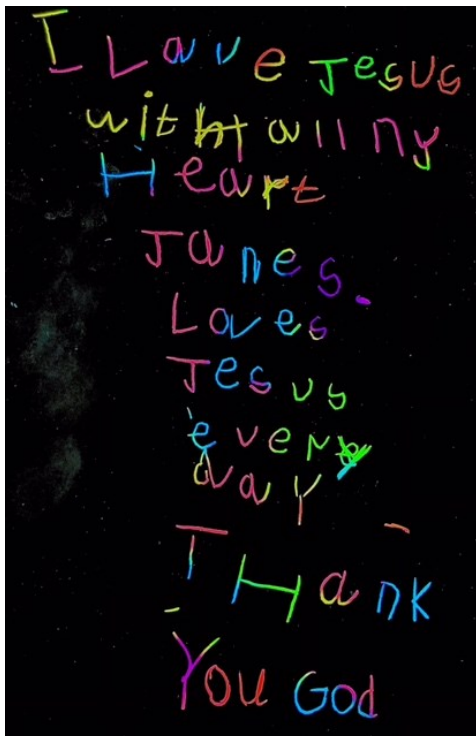

Why We Do What We Do

Every now and then the Lord brings something along to remind us why we do what we do. On one of our recent trips, one of our children drew up this message on his coloring page. If you can’t make it out it reads:

“I Love Jesus with all my Heart”

Followed by:

*“James Loves Jesus every day.
Thank You God”*

That is awesome enough all by itself. But when you consider that this young man is struggling to keep up in school due to some developmen-

tal delays, it is huge! No one prompted this. So to see him express his love for our Lord in writing—that is reassurance that what we’re trying to do is working.

It is important to house, feed, clothe and even get medical attention for our children in need. But all those things are quality of earthly life issues. This message is an eternal life issue.

Sometimes we are asked by potential granting organizations to ensure them we are not “proselytizing.” Can’t do that, “proselytizing” (evangelism) is what we do!



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Building Faith and Dignity

Over twenty years ago I was challenged by a Ghanaian Doctor of Education to work hard at helping to give his people their dignity back. This was a startling request which prompted me to ask for an explanation.

He explained that one down side to missionary activity in Ghana has been an unintentional belief that God could not provide for the needs of Ghanaians except through expats. His request was that we do whatever we can to demonstrate that God can and will provide for Ghanaian ministries “immediately” rather than intermediately. He wanted to see his people believe that God loves Ghanaians directly, He didn’t have to use “the whites” to show his love and care.

My prayer in 2026 is that God would accomplish this dream of 20+ years. Would you please pray with me that God would amaze our brothers and sisters in Ghana (as well as those of us here) with not only his ability, but his willingness to do this. May God use this to restore the dignity and grow the faith of believers across Ghana as He works amazingly to provide for WAMM-Ghana and HOME.
